Steve Rogers, Town Manager, on behalf of Public Works Director Joe Tagliaboschi, presented staff report.

Town Manager Rogers also advised the Yount Street Paving project will be starting this week and should be completed early May.

Town Manager Rogers further commented that upon completion of the Yount Street Paving project and the Yount Street Waterline project, the Town will have invested a little over \$1 Million dollars in public infrastructure improvements. The waterline improvements should provide the Town approximately 50 years of service and the repaving should provide approximately 30-35 years of service.

# 12. COUNCIL MEETING REPORTS, COMMENTS AND AGENDA ITEM REQUESTS

Agendas and Minutes related to Council Members meeting attendance are

maintained separately by the various meeting bodies.

Upper Valley Waste Management Authority (UVWMA)

Mayor Dunbar requested Council Member Mohler start out with a report on Upper Valley Waste Management Authority and the situation at Clover Flat Landfill.

Council Member Mohler and Chair of the UVWMA met in emergency session on April 1, 2019 in Town Hall Council Chambers and there was discussion regarding how busy the Board has been following up on regulatory directives as a result of the fires at the landfill last summer. The regulatory directives came from the County Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) which has regulatory authority over Clover Flat Landfill. The company has only partially resolved some of the directives and has more to comply with. One of the major issues is Clover Flat Landfill has lacked a full-time Site Manager for guite some time and the need to complete a fire suppression system. Council Member Mohler further commented about two weeks ago the LEA inspector, during a regular periodic inspection of Clover Flat Landfill, discovered several locations where leachate (contaminated water) was oozing out of multiple areas of the landfill causing erosion and carrying contaminated leachates from the landfill area to a nearby creek which drains into Dutch Henry Creek which then drains into Napa River. As a result the LEA directed Clover Flat Landfill to resolve the issue by stopping the flow of the leachate water and collecting it into tanks. However, the problem continued to persist so on March 30, 2019, the LEA directed that the landfill be closed to accepting any waste which was then amended ("thank you Steve Rogers") to being closed to accepting public self haul waste but still open to collect franchise waste. In addition to the LEA, the Regional Water Quality Control Board has issued a Notice of Violation with a likely order to abate on the way, and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife is also discussing taking regulatory action with the Napa County District Attorney. The LEA has provided Clover Flat Landfill a deadline of April 2, 2019 at 5:00 p.m. to provide an Action Plan and complete various actions in which the LEA staff will review.

League of California Cities North Bay Division Meeting being held May 16, 2019 in Vallejo will have Senator Scott Wiener there. Senator Wiener is one of the most aggressive and progressive housing advocates in the Capitol.

Mayor Dunbar reported on the following:

Yountville Little League Opening Day was held March 30, 2019 and he recognized Yountville Kiwanis for being out there for the pancake breakfast and wanted to commend Samantha Holland, Parks & Recreation Director. The Mayor said he and Samantha were successful in throwing out the first pitches.

Thanked the Town and Yountville Kiwanis for supporting the brand new scoreboard.

The Napa Valley Transportation Authority (NVTA) Board meeting was held March 20, 2019 and advised the Board gave authorization to staff to move forward to determine specific funding sources for the transit bus maintenance facility.

Council Member Mohler reported she attended the League of California Cities Environmental Policy Committee meeting in Irvine last week. Topic of discussion was regarding a bill for source reduction of plastics that are no longer recyclable.

Council Member Dorenbecher reported she attended the League of California Cities Revenue and Taxation Policy Committee Meeting on March 29, 2019 in Costa Mesa. Met in a joint meeting with Government Transparency and Labor Relations regarding the CalFire California Supreme Court Ruling regarding "airtime". The Committee also discussed bills having to do with housing and the Governor wants to adjust short-term RHNA goals upwards and tie entitlements to transportation (SB1), and a budget update was provided.
